Dear Honorable Chairs:

The Division of Administration, Louisiana State University Health Care Services, and the Department of Health and Hospitals (DHH) reviewed HCR 139 and greatly appreciate your commitment to ensuring critical information is shared regarding the public-private partnerships. We've made significant changes over the past year from an antiquated model of the government-run public hospital system to a system that embraces the ingenuity and efficiency of experienced community partners. The new model of public-private partnerships sustains access to safety-net care while supporting and improving graduate medical education in Louisiana. Though the timeline for the Partnerships was greatly accelerated by the FY 13 FMAP reduction and its corresponding impact to LSU's budget for the hospitals, the State has been able to rapidly transition to the new model and is already seeing positive results.

Enclosed within this response are several documents that address the concerns outlined in HCR 139, including the LSU Health Cooperative Endeavor Agreements Comparison of State Support chart provided by the Division of Administration. This chart clearly outlines the State Fiscal Year 2013 (FY 13) and State Fiscal Year 2014 (FY 14) costs for each partnership hospital. Given the difference in costs for operating these facilities and the FY 14 lease amounts, the net gain to the state is approximately \$146.8 million. According to an analysis by the Legislative Auditor, the hospital partnerships will reduce the State's Unfunded Accrued Liability (UAL) by \$300 million and will reduce the annual costs of the retirement system to government agencies by \$82 million.

As part of the partnership agreements, the State curtails its responsibility for capital construction and maintenance costs of the facilities. This results in substantial savings to the State, which has invested more than \$315 million in recent years, including \$92 million in maintenance/upgrades for all LSU hospitals and a \$225 million investment in State support for the new academic medical center in New Orleans.

Also, enclosed with the response to HCR 139 is the LSU Health Public-Private Partnership Report Card provided by LSU Health Care Services. This report tracks facility statistics with a comparison to pre-partnership figures, the percent patient mix by service, and information regarding offender care.

The first Partnership between LSU and Our Lady of the Lake Hospital is not even a year into operation, but its clinics have cared for more than 86,000 patients. The new around-the-clock urgent care center in North Baton Rouge has treated more than 18,775 patients since it opened and the system's Mid City Pharmacy has filled more than 54,000 prescriptions. The Lake recently opened its LSU Medical Education and Innovation Center, which is a state-of-the-art facility that expands the footprint of academic medicine for Baton Rouge, making the community a destination for physician training, medical care, and research. Per the State's agreement with the hospital, OLOL is on track to become a Level I Trauma Center.

Only some OBGYN services are available at OLOL, the full range of OBGYN, however, are available at Woman's Hospital in Baton Rouge through a contract designed to ensure full OBGYN care for uninsured women. This partnership also provides an invaluable opportunity for graduate medical education for women's health care services.

In Lafayette, private partner Lafayette General Health has reopened clinic and hospital capacity that had previously been shuttered or scaled back by budget cuts, including its reopening of a pediatric clinic and returning its orthopedics unit to full-time status. The hospital has also hired a full-time oncologist and plans to become the region's first Level II Trauma Center. Since the June 24, 2013 start of the new partnership, the hospital and affiliated clinics have served more than 42,000 patients.

In New Orleans, Louisiana Children's Medical Center took over the operations of the Interim LSU hospital. Since completing the partnership, the hospital has increased the emergency department capacity and reopened 75 medical/surgical inpatient beds and nine inpatient psychiatric beds.

Under its partnership with Lake Charles Memorial Health System, W.O. Moss in Lake Charles has established a new urgent care clinic, which means that more patients are able to see a physician outside of expensive and ineffective emergency room settings. The partnership in Lake Charles has also led to the introduction of several new specialty care clinics, including an orthopedic clinic and a breast health clinic. Patients who were previously referred out of town for these critical services can now receive them in their home community.

In Houma, the partnership between Terrebonne General Medical Center and Ochsner has resulted in improvements to patient care with the hiring of new physicians, including a new cardiologist, urologist, and family health physician. Two new mammogram units have been installed at the hospital.

In North Louisiana, the Biomedical Research Foundation is the private partner now operating the hospitals in Shreveport and Monroe – University Health Medical Center Shreveport and University Health Medical Center Conway. Patients in Shreveport are already seeing reduced wait times for emergency room services. In both Shreveport and Monroe, patients have reduced wait times for CT and MRI scans. Additionally, at UH Conway in Monroe, the hospitals now offers the new services of orthopedic surgery, cardiology, and urology.

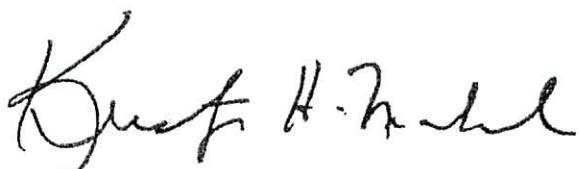
LSU Health Care Services also provided the Hospital Partner Hiring for Transition report enclosed with this letter. Across eight of the public-private partnerships included in the breakdown, 7,532 employees were laid off from the

LSU hospitals during the transition, while a total of 7,510 individuals have either been hired by or offered a job by the new private partner.

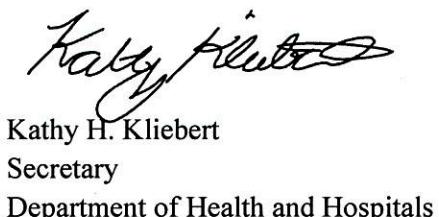
The Department of Health and Hospitals has enclosed the latest Louisiana Medicaid Program Public-Private Partnership DHH Payment accounting report for the current state fiscal year. As of Jan. 27, 2014, DHH paid out \$797.4 million in public, private, uncompensated care, and Title XIX payments to the nine public-private partnerships in operation at the time of the report. Uncompensated care, also called Disproportionate Share Hospital (DSH) payments, are paid at 85 percent after the close of the first quarter and reconciled at the end of the fiscal year. Those payments are adjusted at that time to account for actual claims, as is standard for all hospitals that receive these payments. More than \$313 million remains in the budget for the public-private partnership hospital payments in the current fiscal year.

We thank you for your attention to this issue. The public-private partnerships have been a great success to date, and are spawning a new era of quality health care service for Louisianians. We welcome the chance to meet with you to discuss strategies to accomplish our shared goals and the future of the public-private partnerships.
