Concept mapping is a way to arrange material in a visual manner to assist with your organization, comprehension, and retention of material.

#### **Use Concept Maps to:**

- Brainstorm ideas
- Organize concepts
- Preview a chapter
- Take notes
- Practice retrieval

### Fishbone

Use a Fishbone Map to visualize how details from multiple sources contribute to one theme, event, or main idea.



#### Flower

Use a Flower Map to visualize parts of a whole; expand further with more details.
