-What exactly happened and why?

- Opportunity cost, opportunity lost
- An irreplaceable cyclical moment
- Impact slight on surface, lasting impact will be deep
- Spill hardens, polarizes existing perceptions

- 110 days from blowout to cement
- Trust fund established
- Consolidation of docket
- 74% of oil dispersed or removed
- 40% of fishing areas reopened

 1.2 million evacuees
- \$80 billion in property damage
- Historic New Orleans feared destroyed
- Looting, violence, chaos
- A major port shut down
- Retail gasoline price spikes and shortages not seen since Iran hostage crisis

- Both House and Senate remain in play
- Slight negative for Democrats: a few Gulf Coast seats affected, off-message, distracted
- Not particularly positive for Republicans
 - Bobby Jindal and David Vitter do well
 - Policy victories for Obama drive Republican turnout too
- FL Senate: Three-way race between Rubio, Christ, and a Democrat
- Overhang:
 - Obama on track to lose Senate seats in 2010, a big change from 2009 outlook
 - Dems on defensive in 2012, 2014
- Election outcome: neither side has effective control
 - Tense gridlock, budget focus
 - 2011 is about 2012 cycle

- Congress may pass nothing this year
- The Slow Mo-ratorium
- The Orphan Commission
- Institutional paralysis at Interior Dept.

- Strong asset base, cash flows, and settlement structure
- Economic damages
- Fines, criminal penalties, natural resource damages
- Finger-pointing, negligence, criminal violations: BP vs. partners
- Litigation: class actions, environmental mass torts

- The Deepwater Horizon oil spill narrative is still up for grabs.
- Existing perceptions -- mostly negative -- of the President and Congress have hardened.
- The President loses a chance to reset prior to 2010 election cycle.
- The Gulf becomes a deepwater game for big companies only.
- The spill was no Katrina, Santa Barbara, or Valdez. "Drill, baby, dril may ride again some day.
