Keith Comeaux joined NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory in 2006 to lead Curiosity's entry, descent and landing validation effort. Starting in 2008, he was responsible for leading Curiosity's system test activities during its two year construction through launch at Cape Canaveral in November, 2011. Following launch, Keith served as flight director for operating Curiosity during its cruise to Mars, culminating with its landing on the night of August 5. Presently, Keith is one of several mission managers as Curiosity begins its journey of discovery on the Martian surface.

Before arriving at JPL, Keith worked for Boeing's Satellite Development Center. While at Boeing, he received the AIAA Lawrence Sperry Award in 2001, which recognizes contributions made by aerospace professionals early in their careers.
