

The Graduate Certificate of Preparing Future Faculty

The Graduate Certificate of Preparing Future Faculty (12 credit hours) prepares doctoral students (and other graduate students) for an academic career in a variety of institutional types¹. Students must complete at least 1 course from each of the following three modules. If a course is cross listed under multiple modules (e.g., ELRC 7606, GRAD 7004), it can only be counted toward the requirement of one module. At least 9 credit hours in the minimum required coursework be in courses at or above the 7000-Level. Courses marked with "Online" have an online option.

The use of credit earned towards a certificate may be applied to a master's or doctoral degree but only with the explicit approval of the department offering the degree.

1. Foundational Pedagogy (3-6 hours)

Courses under this module build foundational pedagogy for adult learning and development, and help a student become a more effective teacher in a college and university setting.
