Interested in developing a command of the French language and learning more about French-speaking cultures around the world? The Department of French Studies is committed to increasing public awareness and appreciation of Louisiana's French heritage. The program also offers student and faculty exchange programs with the Université de Poitiers, the Université de Limoges, the Ecole Normale Supérieure de Lyon, and the Université d'Aix-Marseille. The department offers study abroad programs in many diverse locations, including Paris and the Ubaye Valley in the French Alps.

### **COURSE OFFERINGS**

As a French major, you will gain an advantage by acquiring additional skills and knowledge that come with learning another language. There are classes that focus specifically on French literature and culture of a particular location, such as Louisiana, Quebec, North Africa, Sub-Saharan Africa, the Caribbean, and of course, France itself. Some courses have broader themes, such as women's writing or post-colonial writing. Other courses allow you to specialize in a particular time period, studying French literature, poetry, drama, and social life of the 17th, 18th, 19th, or 20th centuries.
