Course Introduction:

The Middle East has uninterruptedly been at the forefront of international geopolitics for almost a century. This enduring geopolitical visibility has important cultural, societal, economic, and security implications at national, regional, and international levels. This course is designed to tackle some of these issues by providing students with a historico-cultural, politico-economic, and geo-strategic survey of the Middle East.

Grading:

Three multiple-choice exams (each consisting of 30 questions with each question worth HALF A PERCENT of the final grade) along with a term paper (35% of the final grade) and active class participation (20% of the final grade) will collectively constitute your grade in the course.

The tests will be based on your general understanding and appreciation of the main themes tackled over the course of the class. An intimate engagement with the assigned readings and video links should do the trick for these tests.

The term paper could address any issue area of your interest in the IR of the Middle East broadly conceived, and should be approximately 2,000 words long. You need to cite at least 5 scholarly works in the paper and submit it electronically via the TURNITIN link I will generate on Moodle. The deadline for submission of this paper is Sunday, December 7th, 2014 at 11:55 PM Central Standard Time.
