    - iii. HSS policies on funding for graduate students
      - 1. Leichman sent out a query to all departments and got very few responses
        - a. He heard from: Poli Sci, Comm D, Comp Lit, and History
        - b. If your department is not listed above, please ask your DGS to respond to Jeff (he will re-send the original email this week)
      - 2. What we've learned so far

- a. At this point, largely due to low response rates, it is very difficult to gauge where we are at as a college.
- b. Move toward leveling-out of stipends creates decreases in some departments and increases in others
- c. Many departments are frustrated and confused by the two/four-year limit on funding (i.e. are students earn a master's and then re-apply for PhD eligible for six years of funding? Are departments "allowed" to offer fifth-year funding?)
- d. In general, we are not competitive with peer programs
- 3. Can we translate the information we're gathering into concrete action from the senate?
- 4. Next steps forward
  - a. Clarify points of confusion
  - b. Seek data regarding recruitment challenges
- 5. Bibler volunteered to help Jeff continue this work; Academic Oversight Committee will also provide assistance
- 6. University FS resolution re: graduate stipend increases (available online: http://www.lsu.edu/senate/resolution%2016-

- d. Facilities planning committee The college has constituted a committee separate from the facilities work the university is doing
  - i. Senate can function as conduit for communication with college administration and contractors
  - ii. Faculty Welfare and Policy Committee may play a role?
  - iii. Some key issues: Mold in offices, terrible bathrooms, accessibility, gender inclusivity/flexibility
- e. Grade inflation/student evaluations/DFWs
  - i. Still unresolved after spring meeting with Dean Haynie
  - ii. Chris Barrett and Kent Mathewson were working on this, but are no longer on the senate.
  - iii. Faculty Welfare and Policy Committee will continue pursuing this.
  - iv. Willie will send the material Chris and Kent's gathered to the committee
  - v. Concerns that this runs afoul of university policy is quite real and a potential avenue for action

    - i. Kevin Cope has indicated that he wishes the college would *elect* it senators for UFS
    - ii. College bylaws call for apportionment, but no elections
