Hearne Eminent Lecture Series

"Deciphering the Beginnings of the Universe: Latest Results and Open Questions"

Over the past twenty years a series of ever more sensitive astronomical observations have provided us with many facts and various clues about the first moments in the history of our universe. In this talk, Dr. Matias Zaldarriaga will summarize our current understanding, some of the open questions and how we might go about tackling them.

Dr. Zaldarriaga has made many influential and creative contributions to our understanding of the early universe, particle astrophysics, and cosmology as a probe of fundamental physics. Much of his work centers on understanding the clues about the earliest moments of our universe encoded in the cosmic Microwave Background, the faint glow of radiation generated by the Big Bang, and in the distribution of matter in the late universe.
