CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by President Olivia Phelps at 10:30 a.m.

ATTENDANCE

There was a quorum with four proxies noted.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Senator Willie Louviere led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES - November 20, 2024, Staff Senate Meeting

A motion to accept the minutes was made by Member-at-Large Tammy Millican. The motion, seconded by President-Elect Quinneka McDonald, carried.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Olivia Phelps reviewed relevant meetings in which she attended.

Phelps attended Holiday on Campus on December 3. It was a wonderful event with over three hundred people who attended. She thanked everyone who helped plan and volunteered during the event.

She attended a meeting a University Budget Committee meeting. The legislature passed some bills that moves some money around to help cover some unfunded liabilities. There is going to be a tuition increase in the fall. With that, there should not be any severe budget cuts expected next year.

Phelps attended the Foundation's Giving Day Kickoff. The goal is to have sixteen donors of \$5 dollars or more. The kickoff day is scheduled in March.

Phelps attended an Administrative Process and Improvement Committee Meeting. The committee is looking at administrative processes on campus and how to streamline better. One complaint is the process to bring international visitors to campus. The online submission form has been updated and is now available on the website. All submissions are considered and passed along to appropriate units for resolutions.

The Staff Senate Executive Committee met with Provost Haggerty. Mike GPT is live. MikeGPT is a custom Large Language Model (LLM) system available exclusively to faculty and staff through LSU single sign-on that provides a private and secure alternative to ChatGPT for general tasks. Students will be granted access to MikeGPT in the spring 2025 semester.

Residential Life will be building more dormitories within the next two to three years.

Workday Student was also discussed. Testing is ongoing to help with the transition. LSU Eunice has already gone live.

Phelps also attended a Campus Safety Meeting. There will be some on-campus training and exercises happening after the first of the year, so be on the lookout for communication of where and when that will be happening.

The Access Control Project with the ability to lockdown buildings and secure campus remotely is being reviewed. There has been some funding that has come through from the Board of Regents for about 25-30 additional Blue Light boxes. Also, there has been one student who was administered Narcan through an AED box on campus.

There are 1,700 cameras on campus with the capability of providing 5,000 different views. Those cameras are scheduled to be upgraded every three years. Those cameras are being used for any hit and run accidents as well as video evidence for any crimes that happen on campus. There are also twenty-eight license plate readers on campus. Some safety regulations are also being discussed with regards to scooters traveling on campus.

Residential Life is reviewing protocols for students on staff violence with one-on-one meetings and how to specifically handle a mental health crisis due to an incident that happened.

The Academic Continuity Plan is being reviewed for updates with regards to Hurricane Response.

The LSU Campus Mounds are among the oldest human-made edifices in the Americas. LSU received some grant money from the National Park Service to preserve the mounds. The grant is part of the federal Save America's Treasures program. LSU will match the grant with an equal amount of funds.
