# **New Patient Welcome Letter & Guide**

### WHO WE ARE

We are committed to providing you with the best quality care and service for your beloved pet family members. We accept patients from throughout Louisiana and neighboring states.

### WHAT TO BRING

To ensure your initial appointment is enjoyable and streamlined, please remember the following items:

- 1. Please fill out the **History Questionnaire** and ensure that all previous **medical records** (including operative reports, x-rays, and laboratory results) of your pet have been forwarded to us before your scheduled visit.
- 2. Current medications (tablets, capsules, ear cleaners, ear drops, shampoos etc.)

### COSTS

The initial examination fee is \$205, and the recheck fee is \$82.50. If additional tests or procedures are needed, we will discuss them with you beforehand, explaining their benefits and associated costs, so you can make an informed decision about your pet's care!

As a state university, with specialists across all disciplines collaborating under one roof, we provide **gold-standard** veterinary care at a **cost-effective** price. Below we highlight some of the most common procedures our service performs, along with their estimated average costs (prices are approximate and subject to change):

- Allergy skin testing (intradermal): \$458
- Allergen-specific immunotherapy (allergy shots or vaccines): \$450
- Skin cytology: \$30
- Skin scrape: \$30
- Bacterial culture and susceptibility: \$156.50
- Biopsy (including histopathology results): \$281
- Professional ear irrigation (video-otoscopy including anesthesia): \$600-\$1100
- CT scan: \$1100

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

If it is possible, please do not feed your pet the morning of the appointment in case sedation or anesthesia is needed. Always allow access to fresh water.

To ensure a smooth start to your appointment, please arrive 15-30 minutes before your scheduled time, to register and become familiar with our facility and staff. If you anticipate being late due to transit delays, please contact us promptly so we can make any necessary adjustments.

We are a Veterinary Teaching Hospital, and you might be greeted by a student who will get a thorough history of your pet, with the guidance of our clinicians. The student will then have you return to the waiting room while your pet is taken into the hospital and evaluated by our specialist doctors.

During your first visit at LSU Veterinary Teaching Hospital, plan to spend approximately **one to two hours**. This time allows us to thoroughly listen to your concerns, carefully evaluate your pet, and develop a comprehensive plan tailored to their needs. **We take the time to provide thorough, personalized care for every patient.** For extensive testing, your pet may need to stay with us for the day, with pick-up typically scheduled between 3:00 and 5:00 p.m. Please do not leave without informing the dermatology service and leaving a number at which you can be reached. We will not be able to proceed with any treatment without your consent.

The purpose of this first visit is:

- to assess your pet's medical history and skin condition
- make a comprehensive plan for testing or treatment
- perform initial diagnostic tests, and initiate treatment

Please note that for medical reasons certain tests and procedures, like intradermal testing for allergies, or professional ear irrigation should not be performed during the initial visit. In that case we will discuss with you how to proceed further, to achieve the best plan for your pet and you.

Once the assessment is complete, the veterinarian and student will return to talk to you about their findings and recommendations. Within 24-48 hours we will share information about your pet's status, conditions, and treatment with both you and your veterinarian via email/fax/mail.
